Recipient for Lambda Tuition Award in STEM Studies: We are very pleased to announce that as of September 2019, we have a recipient for the STEM award given to a LGBT person starting undergraduate studies at the University of Alberta. We hope this will be the first award in a series of tuition awards that Lambda Foundation is preparing to administer for outstanding LGBTI people who have contributed constructive energy to our community and want to take an undergraduate degree. Currently, the Lambda Board is in talks with another anonymous donor who would like to establish a similar award designed to assist incoming LGBTQI2 undergraduate students on an ongoing basis for the duration of their degree based on good academic standing. Lambda in the archives: Thanks to Barbara Freeman, an historian, our historical records are now housed at the City of Ottawa Archives. This was an especially important initiative. This means that our history is safeguarded (not languishing in our basements!) and that future generations will be able to read and write about our history.

First winner for our STEM award! We are pleased to report that we have recipient for the STEM award established for a high school student registered at the University of Alberta. The winner is Spencer O'Hara who will be pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree with a specialization in Immunology and Infection. Spencer is also an active member of the queer and trans community. Congratulations, Spencer!

Lambda's Awards for writing and research:

Most of the money we raise at Lambda Foundation these days still goes into our LGBTQI2 writing and research awards at nine universities across Canada. Our research awards still operate through endowments set up with the universities concerned. When Lambda receives donations, we forward the funds to the host universities at the end of the year, and we also liaise with the on-campus development offices, professors, student associations and campus media to promote excellent applications. The universities invest the endowment funds carefully, each in their own way, and the annual payouts, that is, the interest they earn, constitute the awards. They do not touch the principal. The universities' awards committees (in some cases in consultation with Lambda), decide whose research on LGBTQI2 issues merit the awards.

New Board Member! Sara Bannerman, PhD: We are excited to announce that in September 2018, the Lambda Scholarship Foundation welcomed our newest board member, Sara Bannerman, B.Mus., MA, PhD. Dr. Bannerman is Canada Research Chair in Communication Policy and Governance Associate Professor in the Department of Communication Studies and Multimedia McMaster University. She is currently Co-Vice Chair of Law Section of the International Association for Media and Communications Research (IAMCR) and a Governing Board Member of the International Society for the Theory and History of Intellectual Property (ISHTIP).
